The Sarah T. Hughes Diversity Scholarship was created in 1981 to honor Judge Hughes' pioneering career. The purpose of the scholarship is to increase the diversity of our legal community. Scholarships are awarded to outstanding minority law students who will remain here after graduation, practice law, and become leaders in our community.

The scholarship program has allowed outstanding minority law students to complete a legal education many would have previously thought beyond reach.

One Hughes Scholar said of the scholarship, "This scholarship is a source of empowerment because it places responsibility in the hands of those who have been traditionally under-represented in the legal community".

The students' tuition is funded from the proceeds generated by the annual Bar None show and the Dallas Bar Foundation through their annual dinner event, *An Evening With...*
